Guidelines for reviews in English

A review consists of a maximum of 5000 characters (including spaces). In the first part, an overview of the work or contributions of an edited volume is presented and in the second part, a constructive-critical discussion of the content is conducted.

The text meets the editorial guidelines of the APA.

The primary aim of the review is to introduce the reviewed work to the readers from a constructive-critical point of view (What can be found in the work or edited volume? What audience is it aimed at? How does it connect to the current disciplinary discourse? etc.).

Usually, the review comes out within six months of the publication of the work.

The following information on the reviewed work should be provided in this order:

- 1. Surname of the author
- 2. Initials of the author's first name
- 3. Year of publication
- 3. In the case of edited works / anthologies the indication (Ed.)
- 4. Complete title (in italics)
- 6. Publisher
- 8. Number of pages

Surname, F. (Year of publication). Title. Publisher. XXX p.

Example: Little, T. D. (2013). *Longitudinal structural equation modelling*. Guilford Press. 386 p.

At the end of the text, the information about the author of the review is written in italics: academic title first name surname, higher education institution

Example: Prof Dr. Mara Muster, University of example
